

All transitions require saying goodbye. We've just said our final goodbyes and sent Malar and Rev. Thevanesan off to a new home and a new way of life in retirement.

No doubt this transition in their lives comes with a mix of feelings. One will be the feeling of relief at never having to lead another church meeting or endure any of the conflicts that can arise as church planning teams struggle to work together. That relief may trump any grief experienced in saying farewell to colleagues and to familiar patterns that defined their roles for decades.

Pastors don't simply *do* ministry, they *are* ministers 24/7. Their vocation is a part of their character and lifestyle. Responding to God's call to a lifetime of ministry has allowed God to be present in their lives in unique and surprising ways as they've gone about the business of caring for a community of people and being in a place where they are the center of the action and the primary actors. Still, God is calling them forward in faithful discipleship, but in unknown ways and ways beyond the congregational way of ministry that they've known.

Our church community is journeying through a transition time as well. The relationship we've known with our pastoral leader has changed and that transition requires saying goodbye and letting go of some of the old patterns that have defined us. It may feel like a void for a while as we prepare to birth new possibilities.

Like water flowing in a stream, life goes on. What we have accomplished will become the foundation on which we'll continue to build in the new adventure we're about to begin with Rev. Norrix. At times we may feel wistful about past times and familiar ways. But God is beckoning us to something new and as yet undiscovered. It's a time of new beginnings and Christ is alive and goes before us to show us the way.


All donors get a coupon for a free carton of Friendly's ice cream.
